November 6, 2017 - National Players, America's longest-running tour company, presents *The Great Gatsby* by F. Scott Fitzgerald, adapted for the stage by Simon Levy, touring September through May of 2017-18.

In the Jazz Age of New York City, luxury is everything, and and nobody is more luxurious than the Long Island gentleman with the mansion on the bay. He throws tremendous, barn-burning parties. He owns nothing but the newest and best, from his hydroplane to the very clothes he wears. Nobody knows where he came from, and everybody knows his name—but who is this Jay Gatsby? And what does he see in the dark across the water that would so entice him to sacrifice everything he has?

This fast-paced adaptation of F. Scott Fitzgerald's iconic novel springs to life as the National Players introduce a world of excess at the tipping point: the guests can dance all night, but what happens when the sun comes up?

The Great Gatsby is directed by **Amber Paige McGinnis**, a DC-based artist whose directing credits include *Girl in the Red Corner* at The Welders and *Equus* at Constellation Theatre, both of which were nominated for Helen Hayes awards. Amber is also a screenwriter and film director for WILL interactive. Rounding out the creative team are **Paige Hathaway** (Scenic Designer), **Seth Gilbert** (Costume Designer), **Sarah Tundermann** (Lighting Designer), and **Roc Lee** (Sound Designer), **Kate Brittingham** (Properties Master), and **Casey Kaleba** (Fight Director).

"I moved from New York from Missouri in 1999, and like Nick Carraway, I felt like a fish out of water." says Jason King Jones, Artistic Director of the National Players, "At that time, the story of Gatsby made sense to me as a cautionary tale about the dangers of excess and a warning against equating success with wealth. Today, as conversations surrounding privilege make up an increasingly dominant part of our new cycle, the story of Nick, Daisy Buchanan, and Jay Gatsby resonates more profoundly."

National Players is made up of ten early-career actors, who not only play multiple roles onstage, but also serve as managers, teaching artists, and technicians. This year's National Players are: **Dylan**Arredondo, John Austin, Emily Brown, Melissa Carter, Benjamin DeCamp Cole, Amy Desrosiers, Kelsey Godfrey, Jared Graham, Kenn Hopkins Jr., and Simon Kiser.

The Great Gatsby is one of a trio of plays National Players will tour this year, the other two being **Othello** and **Alice in Wonderland**. Ultimately, National Players will bring their repertory to over 60 venues in 22 states in the next 12 months.
